

Background

From October 21 to 25 2024, Peking University and Sciences Po successfully hosted the "PKU-Sciences Po Climate Week", as Special Events for the 60th Anniversary of China-France Diplomatic Relations. This event series aimed to leverage the academic strengths of both institutions to deepen mutual understanding, strengthen Sino-French cooperation, and contributing innovative mechanisms to global climate governance. It also explored new approaches for cultivating young talent committed to a carbon-neutral future.

During the third state visit to France in 2023, President Xi Jinping emphasized that China and France share a "special friendship and a special relationship", which is rooted in bilateral ties while oriented toward global challenges. He noted that "as two major countries with independent spirits, every encounter between China and France throughout history has sparked tremendous energy and shaped the course of global affairs."

During the Climate Week, a series of activities, including 1 opening ceremony, 4 thematic Symposia, 2 field studies, and 3 public climate lectures were held, with a number of youth forums and exchange sessions. With the supports of the Vanke Foundation, C Force Lab launched the 3C Climate Futures Youth Leadership Workshop, and also developed a variety of communication products to amplify its impact through diverse channels and platforms, prior and after the COP29 which hosted in Baku.

During the Climate Week, the Environmental Transformations Research Institute of Sciences Po and the Institute of Carbon Neutrality at Peking University, in collaboration with multiple partners, organized four thematic Symposia. The topics covered key issues such as global climate governance and negotiations, climate finance and ESG, sustainable cities, and sustainable consumption.

22 October: Global Climate Governance and Negotiation

Within the context of the COP29 under UNFCCC, experts exchanged the current situation of global climate governance, the role of bilateral and multilateral cooperation, opportunities and challenges of global cooperation. The core issues of the global climate governance system, such as geopolitical conflicts, and shortage of funds are exchanged. Experts from the School of International Relations at PKU, and Chinese Academy of Social Sciences attended the symposium.

23 October: Climate Finance and ESG

Finance is not only an engine of economic development, but also an important driver for social green and sustainable transformation. Climate finance has been one of the bottlenecks in global climate governance over the past 30 years. Where will new and additional finance come from? Co-organized by the Institute of Carbon Neutral at PKU, Macro and Green Finance Lab in the National School of Development at PKU, and the Institute for Environmental Transformations at Science Po, experts and scholars from universities, financial regulators, development finance institutions, and international organizations attended. Under the topic of climate finance and ESG, they discussed the financial path of green transformation, putting forward financial solutions to address climate change issues, sharing Chinese and the world's practice and experience in climate finance.

24 October: Sustainable City and Climate Policy

Cities have important strategic position in emission reduction. Currently, more than 70% of global emissions come from cities. The ratio will be close to 80% by 2050. The symposium focused on the role of cities in global climate governance and action, urban planning and renewal, low-carbon transport planning and construction. Representatives from Territorial Planning and Design Institute of PKU (PKUPDI), Institute for Transportation and Development Policy (ITDP), Beijing Municipal Institute of City Planning and Design, Veolia China, Beijing University of Civil Engineering and Architecture, GIZ, and AFD delivered keynote speeches and participated in the round-table discussion.





25 October: Sustainable Consumption

Consumption has a profound impact on the environment. Sustainable consumption has been emerged as new paradigm to address the global challenge of climate change. It meets fundamental human needs by providing goods and services, while minimizes resource use and greenhouse gas emissions. Despite the worldwide growth of environmental awareness, sustainable consumption didn't come into public view. Challenging entrenched consumption patterns requires systemic transformations beyond the aggregation of individual behavioral changes. Representatives School of Economics at Beijing Institute of Technology, Rare Conservation China, Wild Aid China and Science Po delivered keynote speeches. Guests from GIZ, the Green Innovation Development Center and other organizations participated in the round-table discussion on the possibilities and solutions to promote the transformation of sustainable consumption system.


Climate Lecture at the Institut Français


